KHOLIN PAVEL IVANOVICH (born in 1930, Vladivostok)

Member of the Union of Artists. His genres were landscapes and subject paintings. He studied at Moscow State College of Graphics from 1948 to 1952, then at Surikov Moscow State Institute of Arts at E.A. Kibrik`s studio from 1948 to 1952. After graduation he travelled around the country visiting the construction site of Irkutskaya hydroelectric power station in 1956, the one of Abakan-Taishet railway road in 1959, the one of Bratskaya hydroelectric power station ("Builders of Bratskaya Hydroelectric Power Station") and the virgin lands of the Russian North (cycle "Mezen Widows"). Active in Vladivostok. The artist's solo exhibitions took place in 1976 in Moscow and Leningrad. Kholin`s works were regularly exhibited in the USSR and abroad.
